Excursion #1 – Craft Brewing Educational Tour

Excursion #2 – Kwanlin Historic Hike

Join us for a moderate level hike combined with an interpretive chat as we wander through Kwanlin Canyon (formerly known as Miles Canyon) along the Yukon River. You will learn about Gold Rush and First Nations history, geology, local plants and wildlife, and enjoy many outdoor scenic photo opportunities. Rain or shine – dress for the weather; sturdy footwear, water bottle, small light daypack.



Excursion #3 – Farming North of 60

4 ½ hours
6 to 14 persons

Yukoners have raised crops and livestock from the later 1800s and the agricultural scene is growing. Join us as we hit the dirt and head down the beaten road to the rural countryside of Whitehorse to explore our rich Yukon land and learn about the bounty that comes from its soil. We will visit several producing farms, meet passionate farmers, and hear about their start up, challenges, success stories and learn about what ‘farm to plate’ means North of 60.



Excursion #4 – Long Ago Peoples’ Tour

Enjoy an interpretive walk through a re-created village, hear stories, and learn about what life was like for the Southern Tutchone of the Central Yukon. The fully guided tour will take us along the Alaska Highway – an opportunity to also learn about the construction of the highway and how gold rush events changed the Yukon. Traditional tea and Bannock served.
