


NORTHERN DIALOGUES 2024 REPORT

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Northern Dialogues Program 2024 focused on the theme of Remoteness and Sustainable Livelihoods in Rural and Northern Canada. This program united researchers, community leaders, policymakers, and students to examine the unique challenges and opportunities facing rural and remote regions. Key components of the program included:

- A hybrid conference hosted in collaboration with Yukon University in Whitehorse, to foster interdisciplinary discussions and knowledge-sharing.
- A webinar Series, focused on research capacity and sharing knowledge with rural and northern communities.
- The production of the State of Rural Canada Report, featuring contributions from experts across the country, spotlighting sustainability and innovation in remote regions.
- An online platform/website where recorded sessions, presentations, and resources continue to be available, ensuring that the conversation extends beyond the event.


